Subject: Your Salvation Must Be Measured According To The Knowledge Of The Word Of God:

The problem with men and women today is that many of them are in churches and have never found the Holy Spirit. Ninety-nine percent (99%) of those who have backslidden have never been born again or filled with the Holy Spirit. Most don't have this much knowledge of salvation. Most Christians today base their knowledge of being saved on a limited amount of religious teaching that can't save a rat.

You are not saved by knowledge, but your salvation must be measured by knowledge; otherwise, you won't know what you have. You will think you are saved because you shouted and cried one Sunday morning in church because the choir sang a very emotional song. I don't think any music can make you more emotional than the military selection that honor's dead soldiers called "Taps", but it certainly can't save you.

Subject: A Fool Would Not Likely Reject The Plan Of Salvation When He Learns It Of A Truth:

When you have tasted the goodness of the kingdom of God truly, and you know the ways of righteousness, you will rather die than to turn back to the ways of sin without a doubt. Once you get heaven in your view, your mind will be made up and your determination will be sure. There are not many fools who will learn the true knowledge of the way to God's kingdom and reject it for a short season of sin in the world. The Bible teaches that a wayfaring man or fool will not pass by this chance to be saved. These subjects on backsliding and falling are primarily for your knowledge, and not likely to happen to those who learn salvation of a truth. God is married to the backslider and is always willing to take them back.

Subject: God Can Communicate With Anybody:

Whatever the word of God tells you is what it means. If there is something about the word of God that you don't understand, it means that it is not telling you anything. When God wants you to know something, he will make it plain to you.

God knows your ability to comprehend and he is more than able to communicate effectively with you. Is there anything too hard for God? Is there anybody to dull for God to teach?

Subject: A Prophesy To All! (Genesis 49:1):

In the book of Genesis 49:1 it reads as follows:

Verse 1 - And Jacob called unto his sons, and said, Gather yourselves together, that I may tell you that which shall befall you in the last days.

The Word of God is a book of prophesy that can inform everybody on what to expect in the latter part of their lives, based upon how they lived during the former days. Jacob was able to tell each of his sons how their last days would end by examining their present lives.

If you listen to the gospel being preached by a true minister of the gospel, he will be able to tell you what to expect in the latter days of your life. The gospel will evaluate your present life to determine your future. If a person dies before the time of fulfillment of their prophesy, it could be fulfilled in their children.

David had Uriah killed so that he could take his wife, after he had committed adultery with her; and his results was that David's sons committed adultery with his daughters. If a person practices adultery, their children will also commit adultery, unless their children repent and are saved.

Judas betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver, and later hanged himself. If you betray a saved person for money, it could result to your suicide. Whatever is written in the scriptures aforetime (prior) is for our learning that we might not fall into the same traps of those before us. In the book of Romans 15:4, it reads as follows:

Verse 4 - For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.

Too much authority in any walk of life for a young inexperienced person, will result to their fall and failure. This is what happened to Satan; he had a lot of authority with little experience, and fell from his position in heaven. Satan was a beginner, or a novice. In the book of I Timothy 3:6, it reads as follows:

Verse 6 - Not a novice (beginner), lest being lifted up with pride, he fall into the condemnation of the devil.

Too much authority given to a beginner will cause him to be lifted up in pride, and as a result, fall into the same snare that the devil fell in.

If a person tries to set up a trap for a saved person, such as Haman tried to do to Mordecai, then he will be destroyed by his own trap just as Haman was. The sword of the wicked becomes the judgment of the wicked. This process carries such devastating results that after Peter cut off the High Priest servant's ear, Jesus had to put it back on to save Peter from the destruction of his own sword. In St. Matthew, 26:52, it reads as follows:

Verse 52 - Then said Jesus unto him, *Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword.*

During the time of Lot and Abraham, homosexuality was out of the closet, and being practiced openly without shame. As a result, God destroyed the entire city. If we see the same spirit of homosexuality taking place today, you can be sure that God is ready to send destruction again. What God does for one, he does for all if the conditions are the same.
